




Endless Wizard








Use this wizard to create continuous embroideries with alignment stitches.




- Add markers to an embroidery so it can be stitched out repeatedly, as many times as desired.
- After each stitchout, the fabric is re-hooped and markers are used to align the new stitchout to the previous one.




1.	Open mySewnet Embroidery. Choose Blank Canvas. In the Hoop Selection pop-up choose 360x200mm Hoop. Orientation Natural. Click OK	
2.	Go to the Super Design Tab and Search for Flower	
3.	Choose the first flower in the 6th row, Floral 1. Set the Size to 20mm. Click Apply	

5.	Do another search for leaf.	
6.	Choose the first leaf in the 7th row, Ash Leaf. Set the Size to 20mm. Click Apply	
7.	Go to the Home Tab and click on Rotate 45 degrees twice.	
8.	Center the leaf over the flower.	
9.	Click Duplicate.	

<p>10.</p>	<p>Mirror the leaf by clicking on the arrow at the top and place it underneath the flower. Use the arrows on your keyboard to finetune the placement.</p> <p>Change the colors as you choose</p>	
	<p>Combine and ColorSort your combination</p>	
	<p>Click on the Endless Wizard.</p>	
	<p>The Endless Wizard opens and there are several choices available.</p>	
<p>11.</p>	<p>Fabric Direction. This is the direction you want to start and end your embroidery. See how the Start and End markers change according to your choice. Leave it as the default with direction Up.</p>	

	<p>End Marker; This is the type of stitch you want to mark the corners;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Corner • Single Stitch • Tie Off • Line 	
12.	<p>Marker Positions; Choose if you want the marker stitches to be on both sides, Left/Bottom or Right Top</p>	
	<p>Options; Here you can choose how you want your embroidery to match up. By changing the Gap you can get a wider gap or have the embroidereries overlap. Set the Gap to 3mm to have a nice distance between the repeats.</p>	
	<p>Hoop Options shows the chosen Hoop</p>	
	<p>Underneath the Hoop, you will find the information about the new size and stitch count.</p>	
	<p>Click OK and you have your new Endless design with Corner markers.</p> <p>The designs appears as a Group on the Home Tab. If you want to Color Sort your designs, you need to Combine the Group and then do a Color Sort.</p>	
13.	<p>If you have a mySewnet enabled machine, you can send the design directly to the machine Screen, ready to be stitched out. The send options can be found in the top right corner of the screen.</p>	

<p>14.</p>	<p>To save the design click on File and Save As. This will save a .vp4 file that is fully editable again if you want to continue working with it.</p>	
<p>15.</p>	<p>If you want a different format you use the Export instead. Here you will get a list of</p>	
<p>16.</p>	<p>Here you will get a list of all available formats and you can choose the format you need for your embroidery machine.</p>	

<p>17.</p>	<p>On the Export pop-up you also get additional choices under Optimize for Sewing. These are settings you can change in Configure.</p>	
<p>18.</p>	<p>If you open Configure under the File menu and the Export Tab you can select your options. Removing the checkmarks for Combine and Color Sort helps if you want to decide when to do that manually before Export.</p> <p>This is very useful when working with Appliqué designs where you want to keep the number of color blocks for the technique steps.</p> <p>When you have made the changes click Apply and OK.</p>	
<p>19.</p>	<p>Under File and Print, you will get the option to print a template. This is perfect if you want to experiment with the placement or see how the design aligns.</p> <p>Make sure the Design Scale is set to 100%</p> <p>You can choose what information you want on your template by checking/unchecking the boxes under Print Information.</p>	

The embroidery is used as a center decoration on a table cloth. Repeat the design as many times as needed for the length of the table cloth.
