









Quilt Block Wizard





Create a filled or outline quilt block automatically with this wizard.





- Build a block filled with quilting stitches
- Pick a block shape, set the size and add an embroidery design
- Choose a fill style — such as Stipple, Crosshatch or Echo — to fill the area around the design with quilting




<p>1.</p>	<p>Open mySewnet Embroidery. Choose Blank Canvas. In the Hoop Selection pop-up choose 240mm x 150mm Hoop. Orientation Natural. Click OK</p>	
<p>2.</p>	<p>Go to Create, Click on Quilt Block When you open the wizard there are several choices. If you click on them there will be an image representing the finished result.</p>	
<p>3.</p>	<p>In the dialog box, choose Filled Quilt Block; Outline Inner Shape. This means we will create a quilt block with an empty shape in the center Click Next</p>	

<p>4.</p>	<p>In the Select Size dialog box, Set the Shape to 2, rectangle.</p> <p>Enter Size alternative set A to 110mm and B to 190mm Uncheck the Cut Line box, Click Next</p>	
<p>5.</p>	<p>In the Select Shape dialog box there are a lot of shapes to choose from, but this time choose number 3, the square</p> <p>In the Shape Size box, set the Width and Height to 44mm.</p> <p>If Proportional is selected you only have to fill in one of the measurements, the height and width will be exactly the same</p> <p>Move the square to the upper part of the area, leaving approximately the same area around the top and the sides.</p> <p>Click Next</p>	
<p>6.</p>	<p>In the Select Fill Pattern dialog box you can choose from a variety of fill patterns.</p> <p>When you get into the dialog box the stipple pattern will appear.</p> <p>In this case we will click on echo. The pattern changes immediately. If you are not pleased with the outcome, click on Back and move the inner square. Then click on Options</p>	

<p>7</p>	<p>In option dialog box choose Double Stitch, and set Stitch Length to 2mm, click OK</p>	
<p>8</p>	<p>The quilt block is finished, now it is time to add a letter in the open area. Go to letter tab</p>	

<p>9</p>	<p>Choose American Gothic 25-75mm, in the Elegant Category.</p>	
<p>10.</p>	<p>Type the letter you want into the Letters box. Hold down shift key to get an upper case letter Set the size to 35mm</p>	
<p>11.</p>	<p>On the right side of the toolbar, click on Apply</p>	
<p>12</p>	<p>Move the letter into the open area</p>	

<p>13.</p>	<p>Combine the designs to create a complete design with the placement you have. Use Combine All to combine everything in the hoop.</p>	
<p>14.</p>	<p>Note that all the colors are shown in the Color Select list.</p>	
<p>15.</p>	<p>To save the design click on File and Save As. This will save a .vp4 file that is fully editable again if you want to continue working with it.</p>	
<p>16.</p>	<p>If you want a different format you use the Export instead.</p>	

<p>17.</p>	<p>Here you will get a list of all available formats and you can choose the format you need for your embroidery machine.</p>	
<p>18.</p>	<p>On the Export pop-up you also get additional choices under Optimize for Sewing. These are settings you can change in Configure.</p>	
<p>19.</p>	<p>If you open Configure under the File menu and the Export Tab you can select your options. Removing the checkmarks for Combine and Color Sort helps if you want to decide when to do that manually before Export.</p> <p>This is very useful when working with Appliqué designs where you want to keep the number of color blocks for the technique steps.</p> <p>When you have made the changes click Apply and OK.</p>	

20. Under File and Print, you will get the option to print a template. This is perfect if you want to experiment with the placement or see how the design aligns.

Make sure the Design Scale is set to 100%

You can choose what information you want on your template by checking/unchecking the boxes under Print Information.
