PROJECT SKILL LEVEL:

Shopping List

Everything you need to complete this project in one place. Use this convenient checklist to ensure you have all required materials in your sewing room, or take it with you while you shop for supplies.

- Denim Jacket/Trench Coat
- Faux Sherpa Fabric
- SINGER® Heavy Duty Sewing Machine
- Seam Ripper
- All-Purpose Thread
- Tape Measure
- Sewing Scissors
- Ruler
- Fabric Clips

Optional:

- Heavy Duty Sewing Needles

Project Steps

- 1) Take your denim jacket, and measure the collar from end to end. Then, measure the width of the collar.



- 2) Add 1 inch to each side of the rectangle dimensions in the step above. Cut the rectangle out of the shearing fabric.



- 3) Cut 0.5 inch slits diagonally in the corners of the fabric. This will make folding the fabric over the collar in the next step easier.



- 4) Pin or clip the fabric to the jacket collar, folding the fabric over the edge of the collar.



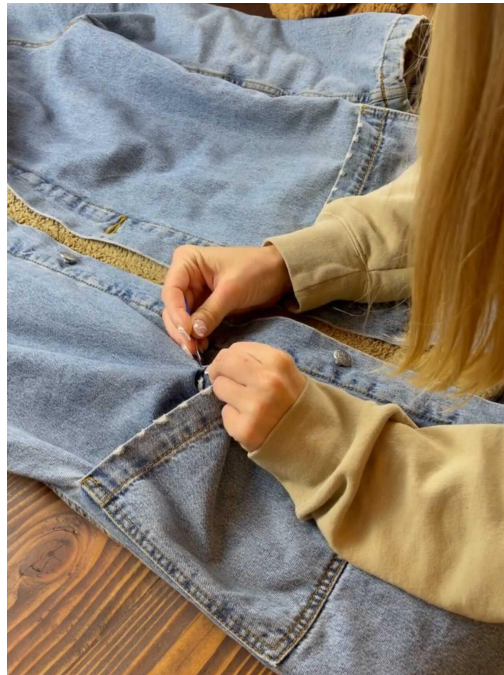
4) Sew along each side of the collar to attach the shearling fabric.



5) At this step, you should now have a shearling collar!



- 6) To create the pockets with shearling trim, Use the seam ripper to remove the seam at the top of the pockets. This will allow you to attach the shearling detail in the next steps.



- 7) Cut a rectangle of the shearling fabric large enough to cover the top plus a seam allowance to fold over the edges.



- 8) Sew along the top of the pocket to attach the shearling fabric. Then reattach the sides that you previously seam ripped. Repeat this step for the other pocket.



- 9) This is the final product! I hope you enjoyed this project!



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
